

Q: What are the secrets to catching speckled trout?

A: Speckled trout anglers are a breed all to themselves. They tend to keep a low profile and don't share a whole lot of information.

Speckled trout are an elusive, challenging fish to catch. Conditions have to be right, your technique has to be solid and your hook-set needs to be right on.

Here are some things I have learned over the years from some excellent speckled trout fishermen and from time spent chasing these fish.

For tackle, I prefer a 7-8 foot light/medium action rod. The longer rod lets you cast your lure further and the soft tip helps you with gently setting the hook. Remember, these fish have extremely soft mouths, so a delicate hook-set

is crucial.

When choosing a reel, look for a medium to low gear ratio. Look for one around 5.1 or under. The Shimano Spheros 5000, the Penn Conquer 5000 or the Fin-Nor Inshore Spinning Reel in the 4000 or 5000 size are all good speckled trout reels.

I like to spool my spec reels with monofilament. I know a lot of fishermen like to use braided line, but remember that monofilament will give you a little stretch, which again, softens the hook-set a bit and won't tear the lure from the fish's mouth. The lighter line the better. Monofilament in the 8-10 lb. test range is perfect. If you do use braided line, just use a 3-4 foot top shot of fluorocarbon leader.

Most of the speckled trout fishermen I know choose MirrOlures as their number one lure for speckled trout. MirrOlures come in various styles, but you want to choose ones from their "Sinking

Twitchbait" line. I haven't done well with topwater lures for specs. My favorite lures are ones in the 52M series, a MirrOlure classic. These lures sink at a rate of 1 foot per second and don't appear to have much action, but speckled trout love them. My 1st choice is their 52M-808 which has a black back, fluorescent orange belly and gold scale. My number two choice would be the 52M-11 that has the classic red head, white back and belly and silver scale. My third choice would be the 52M-704 that has a fluorescent hot pink back, yellow belly and silver scale. This one is also known as the Texas Chicken. Other good colors are the "PD" (Purple Demon), "NS" (Night Stalker) and the #18 that has a green back, white belly and silver scale.

I have also found MirrOlures in the STTR and the TT series to be effective. I like the root beer colored lures.

Sometimes, speckled trout

will hold on the bottom, so another good lure to use is a 1/4 to 3/8 oz. jig head tipped with a 4-inch curlytail in a metal flake style. Good colors for the curlytail are silver, root beer, smoke and chartreuse.

When it comes to colors, speckled trout can be very finicky. During one part of the day they may be hammering a certain color, and in the next instance you couldn't buy a bite. Don't be afraid to change lure color. Make a couple of casts and if you don't get a hit, change it up.

Conditions are important no matter what type of fish your are targeting. For speckled trout I like clean, green water. The current has to be moving and I prefer the

Ask a Pro continued:

outgoing tide when the bait is being pushed down the bay. Give me a 20 knot, northwest wind on the front edge of an approaching system and 6-feet of water that has a broken shell, gravel or sandy bottom and I am right where I want to be. Water temperatures should be in the low-50's to the mid-60's. This is typically conditions we can find in the fall which coincides perfect when the fish are more concentrated, getting ready for their migration.

As far as technique is concerned, I cannot over emphasize a slow lure retrieval. This is key to hooking speckled trout. Stealth is another important aspect. These fish can spook easily, so you don't want to go flying into your spot. I like to arrive as quietly as possible. After I set my anchor with my bow into the current, I usually wait for 10-15 minutes before I throw my first cast. This lets everything settle down. I then cast perpendicular to the boat and let the lure tumble into the tide, slowly sinking as it moves towards the back of my boat. If the current is really moving, I

wait longer to begin my S-L-O-W retrieval to allow my lure to sink. Most strikes seem to happen just as the lure is swinging around the back corner of the boat, right before it is directly behind us. When I am using a MirrOlure, I only use a slow retrieval technique. If I am using a jig head, I will give the rod a slight twitch, but also keep the retrieval as slow as possible. If think you are retrieving as slow as you can... go slower!

When the strike happens, DO NOT set the hook like you see those bass fisherman do on TV. Let the line come tight and crank through it. A hard set will only tear the lure from the fish's soft mouth.

Speckled trout fishing can be a lot of fun and be prepared, it can be addicting. When you think the bite may be over, keep fishing. It tends to occur between mid-September when the bunker are moving out of the bay up to the 1st week in December.





Ocean City Fishing Report

by Larry Jock



Finally, there is some excitement in the air with anglers catching stripers off the beach, a few flounder in the bay, tog around the South Jetty and tuna offshore.

Tuna

The warm water that stretched from the Baltimore Canyon down to the Washington Canyon had tuna fishermen chomping at the bit.

Yellowfins were caught by several boats with fish averaging around 35-45 lbs.

On Friday, the "Foolish Pleasures" returned to the Ocean City Fishing Center with 8 yellowfins in the box. Capt. Dale Lisi ran to 100 fathoms on the west wall of the Baltimore Canyon where he found water temperatures hovering around the 68-degree mark. Capt. Dale reported that the bite started around 8 am and finished up by 10 am.

On Saturday, the "Restless Lady" ventured a little further, ending up in 500 fathoms in the Baltimore Canyon where they caught a 130 lb. mako shark and a 42 lb. yellowfin tuna.

Sunday morning, the "Wrangler" returned from an overnight trip with 6 yellowfin tuna that averaged 33 lbs. Like the "Foolish Pleasures", Capt. Craig



On Saturday, Nick Parr landed this 42-inch striper while surfcasting off Assateague Island right before dawn. Nick was using a bunker head for bait and weighed the 30 pounder at Buck's Place.

Mercier found his fish in 100 fathoms on the west wall of the Baltimore Canyon. Trolled ballyhoo and spreader bars did the trick.

The "Cindy Sue II" out of Indian River caught 2 yellowfin tuna, a bluefin tuna and a 151 lb. swordfish during an overnight trip to the Baltimore Canyon.

Sharks

As mentioned earlier, the "Restless Lady" boated a 130 lb. mako shark on Saturday, the same day that "No Shop Talk" hooked into a 168 lb.

mako around the Sausages.

Captains fishing for tuna in the Baltimore Canyon reported all the blue sharks you wanted.

Flounder

Flounder fishing is pretty slow right now. Water temperatures are around 65-degrees, but anglers continue to be frustrated with dirty water. The slur in the bay, especially behind Assateague Island, make it practically impossible to fish. You spend more time picking it off your bait than you do fishing.

During the middle of the week, there was a good

flounder bite near the Rt. 90 Bridge. The fish were too small to keep but plentiful.

On Saturday, the "Get Sum" did manage to get 3 keepers in the Thorofare. The fish measured up to 19-inches and were caught on Gulp! Swimming Mulletts.

Flounder finally started to show up in the East Channel, south of the Rt. 50 Bridge, on Sunday. Fish were too small to keep, but it's the first time we have seen them in this popular location.

Bluefish

Snapper bluefish were stacked around the Rt. 50 Bridge on Sunday morning. Big Bird Cropper and Dave Leizear caught a load of snappers while tossing Roy Rigs during the outgoing tide. Once the wind shifted and the slur moved in from behind Assateague, the water became too dirty and the bite turned off.

Tautog

Don't forget that you can only keep two, 16-inch tog from May 16th to October 31st.

The South Jetty produced some nice catches of tautog during the week.

Anglers on the "Lucky Break" caught 9 keepers and a bunch of throwbacks during the last of the incoming tide early in the week.

On Sunday, the tog bite was very good around the South Jetty. Unfortunately, the fish were too small to keep, averaging 14 to 15.75-inches. That 16-inch minimum size makes it tough for bay anglers.

Capt. Nick said that they would have had their limit of tautog had the minimum size not increased to 16 inches.

Inshore on Saturday, the "Jezebel" had 8 keeper tog while fishing at the Great Eastern Reef and the Bass Grounds.

Striped Bass

The weekend saw a good number of small stripers being caught around the North Jetty and the Rt. 50 Bridge. Anglers tossing swim shad lures did well.

Striper fishing off Assateague continued to be excellent. Anglers had to battle through sharks and skates to get their striper, but fish over 40-inches were caught by surfcasters throwing peeler crabs, bunker chunks and heads.

Before the heavy rains on Wednesday, the bite was good, but Thursday slowed due to dirty water caused by the storm. On Friday, the bite was strong with several fish over

40-inches getting caught.

On Saturday, Nick Parr caught himself a beautiful 42-incher right at dawn while using a bunker head for bait. Nick's fish tipped the scale at 30 lbs.

Sea Bass

Maryland's sea bass season opens up on May 19th and from the sound of it, there are plenty out there to catch. Reports coming in from "B" Buoy, the Great Eastern Reef and around the Bass Grounds have all bragged about good sea bass bites.

The minimum size remains at 12.5-inches and anglers are allowed to keep 25 fish per trip/day.

The first tournament out of Ocean City is the 3rd Annual Ocean City Marlin Club Bluefish Tournament on May 26th and 27th. For more information, check out their ad on page 19 or go to their website at www.ocmarlinclub.com.







Driftin' Easy

"What color flounder rig should I use? What color Gulp! is best? What color lure should I use?"

What color rig, lure or artificial bait like Gulp! is always a topic of conversation in a bait and tackle shop. The most tried and true way to decide the best color is experimentation. If you have four guys on the boat fishing for flounder, everyone should start off with a different color. When the fish start biting one over the other, that's the one to switch to!


There are four things you have to consider when you choose what color rigs, bait or lure to use.

- Water clarity
- Weather conditions (sunny, cloudy, day or night, dusk or dawn)

- What the fish are feeding on- Are they feeding actively?

- Water depth


"I heard chartreuse was always a good color to use!"



For years, chartreuse was the color of choice for anglers fishing for flounder and when Gulp! took over the market, chartreuse was always the best color. Last year white outsold chartreuse three to one. Go figure. Three color combinations that always seem to work in saltwater are: yellow / white, chartreuse/white and red/white. In the spring pink or pink/white works well.

Fluorescent colors like chartreuse can be seen further in the water when the water is murky or greenish. When the fish are not biting aggressively and are having a hard time seeing the baits, chartreuse blades or chartreuse Gulp!

may be the ticket. But when the fish are really turned on in a feeding frenzy eating some natural bait in the water, a natural color such as white, yellow or pink may produce more bites. This is because fluorescent colors are not natural to the environment.



When a lure or rig hits the water in our coastal bays, 60% of the color can disappear by the time the rig falls ten feet. The deeper you are fishing, the less important color is and the more important it is to have motion, scent and contrast of light/dark colors. A lure may look only gray or black to the eyes of a fish once the light has filtered out the color. Rig manufacturers know this. That's why they often make a rig with contrasting colors like white hair and red beds. If the fish doesn't see one color, it may see the other or a contrast of light/dark to make it more visible. Also, a fish like a flounder is looking up, so the contrast of the bait against the color of the sky can make a big difference. That's why on cloudy days a darker color like purple may work and on sunny days in clear water, a color like white may work best. In clear, shallow water, colors will look like the colors they are. In deeper water, the colors are more like shades of gray and black.

Some fish sense polarized light more than others. What??? Light waves are produced by vibrating electric charges and it's in the water more at dusk and dawn than at any other time of day. That's why some fish like striped bass seem to feed best at this time of day. These light waves in the water also help some fish feed in low light conditions. Tinsel and Mylar that are in flounder bucktail teasers are excellent reflectors of polarized light. The bucktail material itself is not a good reflector of polarized light, so that must be why on some days, especially early and late in the day, Mylar in your bucktail flounder jig can be quite helpful.

Color of the lure is not the only criteria when fishing. Most fish are nearsighted (objects in the distance appear blurry and out of focus) and the fish need to get "up close and personal" to really see the bait. A flounder may look up and see the contrast of two colors against the sky. More contrast (darker colors) is good if the sky is dark and cloudy. Use less contrast (and lighter colors) if the sky is sunny. Remember the old flounder saying, "Dark live minnows on a cloudy day and bright light-colored frozen shiners on the sunny day."

Sound and smell are just as important as sight. Sound travels five times faster in water than it does in the air. That's probably why the striper bite will quit at the South Jetty once the boat traffic gets up!

The sense of smell for a fish is a million times better than humans. So that's probably why Gulp! and Fish Bites work so well! Jigging a bait up and down will not only give motion, but it will also create some sound to entice the fish. Combining a Gulp! artificial bait with a minnow will give contrasting color plus it will give you more scent and motion in the water! Putting a white strip of squid with a dark live minnow will

also give you color contrast plus it will give you more scent. Scented squid strips will also give off the marinated shedder crab oil scent into the water.

"Why are dark colored lures good at night?"



Black and dark purple lures at night are sometimes really good for striper anglers. If the sky is dark, black gives us the best silhouette because black is the least transparent color in the water. Fish look up and can really see that black colored lure! If the moon is out and bright, a lighter color may work better. Then of course, you have to factor in what the fish are feeding on and "match the hatch" so all the color theories can be thrown out the window! If the stripers are feeding on baby sea trout and sea trout color Tsunami lures are working, then, that's the way to go! But, the rule of thumb in places like the Indian River Inlet have always been "light or white lures during the day and dark lures at night."

Sometimes all the theories can be thrown out the window and the lure/bait you believe in most will work. A plain, live minnow on the hook may wind up being the best bait of the day and throw out all the fancy rigs. But if you go flounder fishing with Capt Monty on the "Morning Star", you will see that the technique of jig, jig, twitch and twitch... combined with the fancy Mylar teaser tails and certain color beads (sight and contrast), and a certain bait (scent) will... well... you just got to see it to believe it....

Good fishing....







Striped Bass Stew

- 1 TBSP. extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 garlic clove, finely chopped
- 1 fennel bulb, trimmed, halved and thinly sliced
- 1 large tomato, cut into large dice
- Salt and pepper
- 4 cups low-sodium chicken broth
- 12 oz. skinless striped bass cut into 1 inch pieces
- 1/2 lb. medium shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 1/2 lb. scallops
- Crusty bread, for serving

In a Dutch oven, combine oil and garlic; cook over medium-high heat until garlic is fragrant, 1 minute.

Add fennel and cook, stirring frequently until slightly softened.

Add tomato, season with salt and pepper; cook 3 minutes. Stir in broth and bring stew to a gently boil. Reduce to a simmer. Gently fold in seafood. Return to a bare simmer and cook until seafood is opaque throughout, about 3 minutes. Serve stew topped with a drizzle of oil along with crusty bread. Serves 4.

Flounder Piccata

- 4 flounder fillets
- Salt and pepper
- Flour, for dredging
- 2 TBSP. butter
- 3 TBSP. extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1/2 cup dry white wine
- 1 lemon (1/2 zested and juiced, 1/2 cut into wedges)

3 cups salad greens
2 TBSP. capers, drained and rinsed
1/2 cup fresh parsley leaves

Pat fish dry; season with salt and pepper. Place flour in a shallow bowl. Dredge fish in the flour; shake off excess. Heat 1 TBSP. each butter and oil in a large non-stick skillet over medium-high heat. Add fish and cook, turning once, 3 minutes per side. Transfer to plate and cover with foil. Place garlic in same skillet; cook 30 seconds. Remove skillet from heat and add wine, lemon zest and lemon juice.

Return to heat and cook, stirring until wine is slightly reduced. Season with salt and pepper. Toss the greens with 1 TBSP. olive oil, salt and pepper to taste. Place fish on 4 plates. Add the remaining 1 TBSP. butter to the sauce in the skillet; stir until melted. Pour butter sauce over fish. Wipe out skillet and heat remaining 1 TBSP. olive oil over high heat. Add capers and parsley and fry until crisp, 1 minute. Sprinkle over fish. Serve with salad and lemon wedges. Serves 4.

Bring water to boil in sauce pot; add 1/2 tsp. salt, and pasta; cook 5 minutes. Add broccoli and carrot; cook 3 minutes. Drain over a bowl, reserving a 1/2 cup of the pasta water.

Creamy Linguine with Shrimp and Veggies

- 6 quarts water
- 1 tsp. salt, divided
- 8 oz. uncooked linguine
- 3 cups broccoli florets, cut small
- 1 1/2 TBSP. butter
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 1 cup sliced mushrooms
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 3/4 lb. medium shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 1 carrot, small strips
- 3/4 cup cream cheese
- 1/4 tsp. salt and pepper

Bring water to boil in sauce pot; add 1/2 tsp. salt, and pasta; cook 5 minutes. Add broccoli and carrot; cook 3 minutes. Drain over a bowl, reserving a 1/2 cup of the pasta water.

Melt butter in a large nonstick skillet. Add onion and mushrooms; saute 5 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Add garlic, saute 1 minute. Add pasta mixture, pasta water, cream cheese, remaining salt and pepper to pan. Cook until cheese melts and shrimp are done, stirring occasionally. Serves 4.

Grilled Tautog with Herb Butter

- 1 whole tautog, gutted and cleaned
- 2 TBSP. lemon juice
- 1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 TBSP. minced parsley
- 1 TBSP. rosemary
- 1 TBSP. dill

Herb Butter Ingredients:

- 1/4 cup butter
- 3 TBSP. chopped parsley
- 3 TBSP. tarragon chives
- 1/4 tsp. grated lemon zest
- 2 tsp. lemon juice
- 1/8 tsp. cayenne
- 1/8 tsp. salt

Place whole fish in salt water and let soak for 30 minutes.

Rinse well and pat dry with paper towels.

Mix all of the above ingredients in a bowl.

You can make your own marinade of 1/2 cup Italian dressing thinned with 2 TBSP. of lemon juice or white wine vinegar.

Place the fish and the marinade in a plastic bag and refrigerate NO LONGER than 1/2 hour.

Drain fish and pour the marinade into a small pan to brush on the fish while grilling.

Grill fish, depending on the thickness, 4 to 15 minutes; do not overcook.

Test center for doneness with fork.

Serve immediately with herbed butter.

Serves 4.

Delaware Fishing Report

Welcome to another week of the Delaware Fishing Report. Although we had nasty weather during the week, the weekend turned out nice and anglers were able to get out into the bay and off the coast.

Striped Bass

In comparison to prior weeks when we saw a fantastic night bite in the Indian River Inlet, striper action slowed a bit last week. That's not to say fish were caught, it just wasn't as fast and furious as it has been in the Inlet.

The bite was very good in the inlet on Thursday night and in the surf on Friday morning, but weekend anglers didn't fare well unless you were fishing off of the tip of the jetty. Jetty anglers tossing swim shads and bucktails off the tip continued to do well. Boat anglers had trouble getting close enough to the tip without having bucktails ricochet off their bow.

At Bill's Sport Shop in Lewes, DE, Bill Jr. said that between Thursday afternoon and Saturday morning the striper bite between Gordon's Pond, north of Rehoboth, to the Naval Crossing "was on fire"! Anglers fishing with clams, bunker chunks and bunker heads were landing fish upwards of 43-inches.

Unfortunately, surfcasters fishing along the beaches south of Dewey Beach saw a much slower bite, especially when compared to prior weeks.

Joe Morris at Lewes Harbour Marina reported that striped bass also showed up on structure at the mouth of the Delaware Bay and along the rocks of the Ice Breakers and the Outer Wall. Anglers throwing Bombers, bucktails and Stretch 12 plugs during early morning hours did well.

Sharks

Anglers chasing tuna in the canyons ran across their fair share of blue sharks and a few makos in the Baltimore Canyon.

Contrary to rumors, no thresher sharks were landed. There are all the sea bass you

want to release around "B" Buoy, according to Bert at Hook'em & Cook'em. This means that thresher sharks aren't far behind. Some have been hooked, but all were lost.

Bluefish

According to Capt. Bruce at Capt. Mac's Bait & Tackle, bluefish in the 15 to 18-inch range showed up late in the week in the Indian River Inlet and in the surf along Delaware beaches.

Flounder

Fortunately, Delaware anglers are faring much better than Maryland anglers when it comes to flounder fishing. The water in the bays is a little cleaner and the slur isn't anywhere near as bad as it is in Ocean City.

Joe at Whitetail Taxidermy and Outdoor Supplies said that flounder are being caught in Massey's Ditch and Baker's Channel on bare hooks tipped with bull minnows.

According to Joe Morris at Lewes Harbour Marina, dirty water also hampered flounder fishermen in the Lewes Canal, but southerly winds predicted

for this week should clear the water up just in time for the Lewes Canal Flounder Tournament on Friday, May 18th. Sign-ups will only be accepted up to 7am on Friday.

Tautog & Sea Bass

Delaware's tautog season closed on May 11th and won't reopen until July 17th. Sea bass season is scheduled to open on May 19th.

Prior to the tog season closing, anglers were having good luck fishing around the Outer Wall with green crabs.

As stated earlier, the area around "B" Buoy is holding good numbers of sea bass and the Great Eastern Reef has also produced some nice catches. Those fishing on the "Judy V." released a lot of tautog and sea bass last week according to Bert at Hook'em & Cook'em.

Weakfish

Joe Morris at Lewes Harbour Marina said that weakfish were the other exciting news from Broadkill Beach. Throughout the spring, commercial netters reported significantly more trout than in past seasons, and now that water temperatures have risen, hook and line fishermen are starting to catch some.

Black Drum

Quite a few boomers were weighed in according to Joe, with several coming in at more than 70 lbs. Black drum have settled into the Coral Beds and peak time should be right around the corner with the next full moon on June 4th.

Tuna/Swordfish

The warm water that stretched from the Baltimore Canyon down to the Washington Canyon had anglers anxious to chase yellowfin tuna.

Some boats returned with good catches from 60 to 100 fathoms in the Baltimore Canyon, where captains found water temperatures hovering around 65-degrees.

On Sunday morning, the "Cindy Sue II" returned from an overnight trip with a 151 lb. swordfish, two yellowfins and a 60 lb. bluefin. All were caught in the Baltimore Canyon.







Ship to Shore

COMMUNICATING ON THE WATER- WHAT'S NEW?

Without question, the most dependable and useful means of communication on the water is a VHF radio. Yes, there are cell phones and single-sideband radios and even a few CB radios around, but the VHF is your best communications solution. They have been in existence for years and for many models, they were largely unchanged. However, we now find that manufacturers are taking a second look at them and adding some very worthwhile features.

All basic VHF radios are the same. They are regulated at 25 watts of output and their channel line-up is set by the

FCC. For several years now, they have been required to be manufactured with DSC capabilities, meaning they are able to make selective calling to one or more pre-selected VHF's and, in an emergency, they can transmit a distress signal that identifies the vessel and its location. After March 2011, those units must be Class D, meaning they can monitor the designated DSC emergency channel while communicating on another channel. Beyond that, there are features that some radios have which are not commonly available, including a few brand new features. Here is a list of some of the familiar features that many of them have but are not new:

- Waterproof and, in some cases, submersible

- Able to adapt to a full function remote microphone in addition to the original
- Hailer function (listen only)
- Scanning
- Weather alert function
- Capability of accommodating an external speaker

This season, there are some new models and/or new features that have appeared. Garmin has a model that is a black box radio where the main box is mounted out of sight and the radio is controlled by the microphone handset as well as one unit that has its own internal AIS receive-only function. Standard Explorer has a model that contains its own built-in GPS eliminating the need to interface your GPS to your radio for DSC and providing another GPS on board. Icom has a new model that offers easy software design that places available functions along the bottom of the display screen making selection of features much faster. It also has a function called AquaQuake that allows the user to activate a low frequency sound that actually "pops" the speaker to push out water that may have settled into the front of the

radio. They also feature a special noise cancelling design that Icom says will eliminate up to 90% of background noise making speaking and listening much clearer.

For all VHF radios, the full implementation of the Coast Guard's coastal search and Rescue digital system called Rescue 21 eliminates gaps in VHF coverage over the entire 40,625 miles of the coastal United States. This will virtually guarantee reception of MAYDAY signals from VHF radios within 20 miles of the U.S. coast. It also provides for digital recording and playback of those calls.

These new features are impressive and, if they perform well over time, can be expected to be included in some fashion into most models by all the major manufacturers unless under patent protection. Before purchasing a new radio, however, you need to keep in mind that fancy features are great but the most important feature is reliability, output power, clarity of signal and dependability.



Chum Lines

Most sportsmen will agree that time spent in the woods or on the water is as necessary to their own health (and perhaps sanity) as anything else in life. Getting out and about in the natural world tends to put many of life's problems into perspective; it calms the spirit, and relieves our daily stress. Of course, those with a home and family know that time-off from work doesn't necessarily translate to time spent with rod or gun in hand. Far too many responsibilities follow the family-man or woman around to allow them to go directly from work to play.

Happily, enjoying outdoor recreation and spending time with our children need not be mutually exclusive passions. Combining the two can lead to rewards far beyond anything anyone can achieve by going it solo. Adults who have helped children catch their first fish, or take their first game, know the immense satisfaction derived from introducing a youngster to a part of life that will never be experienced from an X-Box game or a computer monitor.

But sportsmen who take youngsters out hunting or fishing must also keep in mind that their own priorities will probably have to be altered to accommodate their apprentice tag-a-longs. Rather than worrying so much about the

outcome (what is caught or killed), the focus of the day must fall more on the total experience and lessons learned by going through the motions. Sure, a child would like to shoot a bunch of ducks or catch a stringer of flounder, but even if they don't, you can bet that they're going to have a ball trying. They'll also be ready to go again the first chance they're given, unless perhaps some adult paints the outing as unsuccessful and a lousy time just because they didn't "get anything."

Taking a child along on a hunting or fishing trip requires adults to slow down and be ready to exhibit extra measures of patience and tolerance. Try as they might, young children simply cannot keep up with, or endure, so much of what adults can - simply because they're small. Children get cold easier, get tired quicker and hungry more often.

In order to keep up with an adult's normal walking pace, a small child must walk twice as fast. Their little feet will constantly get stuck in muddy holes and every time you pull them out their boots will come off. Kids can have trouble keeping quiet, still and focused for long periods of time as they wait for game to come or fish to bite. They will learn to overcome these setbacks, but in

the meantime adults must be patient, take it all in stride, and do their best to make a child's time outdoors as comfortable and enjoyable as possible.

Sportsmen must also be prepared for odd reactions by children who don't always know what to do as events unfold. A friend told me about taking his son along with him while bow hunting one morning. The little guy sat very quietly in the tree stand with his father until a huge buck deer stepped into view. Suddenly he jumped up and shouted, "There's one dad!" Needless to say "dad" could only sit and watch as one of the biggest deer he'd ever seen turned tail and ran off. Fortunately my friend had the good sense not to get mad at his son, using the experience instead as a way to explain how easily a deer will react to a yelling, screaming and jumping six year old.

A while back I had a group book my charter boat for a day of bluefishing. Among them were a couple of young children. Their father was hoping that the sight of a big bluefish would not frighten either of his children. As we waited for the chum to attract something to our hooks, the kids passed their time playing with the small baitfish we had laying in a bucket of ice at the back of the boat. After a while they started periodically dropping a bait overboard and staring into the water as it sank out of sight - or so we thought.

"Better not throw all our bait overboard or we won't have any left to fish with." I said, as another piece hit the water.

"We're feeding the sharks" one replied.

"But that's our bluefish bait." I reminded them.

"Sharks like it too," another one said.

"What makes you so sure?" It wasn't until I heard "we see them eating it" that I got off my butt, walked to the back of the boat to see what was going on. I was amazed to find two 4-foot dusky sharks happily snapping up every bait the

kids were dropping overboard. I walked into the cabin and told their father that he needn't worry about his kids being frightened by big bluefish.

Adults should look for the chance and welcome every opportunity to take a youngster along their outdoor adventures and remember that, unlike so many of us "old folks," a fun time outside for kids doesn't require that there be a hard and fast goal like catching a cooler full of fish or shooting a bunch of game. Children will certainly get a kick out of that too, but they can also have very memorable times poking around local marshes, exploring woodlots, going for a boat ride or hiking down the beach. In other words - just getting outside.

Remember too the inescapable fact that someday we'll all be "too old" to go fishing or hunting by ourselves, and when we reach that stage of our lives we'll be hoping that our children or grandchildren will remember how many times we took them along on such trips and reciprocate by taking the time and making the effort to do the same for us.

Finally, there's no need for anglers to leave their kids at the dock just because they enjoy the fun and competition of tournament fishing. This summer there's at least four tournaments in Ocean City that either have youth divisions or are directed at kids altogether:



Virginia Fishing Report

Dr. Julie Ball

A brief break in the weather last weekend allowed boats to get out on the water. The fishing results were mixed, but the best inshore action came from the eastern side of the Bay where drum and flounder stepped up to the plate.

The drum scene is still heating up, with an escalation in black drum activity within Bay waters adding to the momentum last week. According to the folks at Chris' Bait and Tackle, the larger black drum are now beginning to show in their usual haunts along the Bayside area of the Eastern Shore. Blacks pushing to over 46-inches are taking chowder and sea clams between Buoys 13 and 16 along Latimer Shoal and near Nautilus Shoal. This

black drum action should continue to improve over the next week or so, providing plenty of opportunities to enter Chris' Individual Black Drum Tournament, which runs May 1st to the 31st (www.chrisbait.com).

Big red drum are still patrolling the breakers off of Smith and Fisherman's Island, with the incoming tide providing the best results lately. Surf anglers are still faring very well on the reds from Smith and Myrtle Islands, with good sized striped bass to over 41-inches also taking offerings. The red drum action is also picking up along the Nine-Foot Shoal area, especially in the evenings. Both peelers and blue crabs are working well, but bunker will also get the job done.

The Bay's Spring Trophy Striped Bass season is going well, but be sure to check the regulations closely and note that these fish must be reported. Anglers are experiencing excellent striper

action all over the lower Bay when they can get out. Topwater action is the most popular method to entice fish exceeding the current 32-inch minimum size requirement, especially along the pilings and islands of the CBBT and the HRBT at dawn. Boats are also reporting catches of rockfish while bottom fishing for drum near Fisherman's Island, with a few exceeding 44-inches. Kendall Osborne of Virginia Beach earned a state release citation with an impressive 44-inch rockfish caught on the fly while working the CBBT last week.

Flounder action around the CBBT still has room for improvement, and the recent cold front and heavy rain is not likely to help either. But anglers working the various lower Bay and Eastern Shore inlets and shallow backwater areas, are finding some keepers. Both Rudee Inlet and Lynnhaven River are providing some good fish, with a few flatfish ranging up to 23-inches last week. Limits

of decent flatties ranging from 3 to 5-pounds are also still coming from the seaside inlets out of Wachapreague and Oyster.

Bluefish are still the word along the Virginia Beach oceanfront and inside Rudee Inlet where anglers are experiencing good catches of decent blues weighing up to around five pounds.

The Virginia Beach Fishing Center reports that anglers are also catching good numbers of speckled trout within Rudee Inlet lately, with any color grub doing the trick. The Elizabeth River is still producing some speck action, and a few fish are also hitting within the Eastern Shore seaside inlets and the back waters of Oyster.

Surf and pier anglers are pulling small spot, sea mullet and medium-sized croaker out of the surf line off Ocean View and Little Creek. Nice-sized sea mullet are also still active on the Eastern Shore seaside inlets and off Kiptopeke. Big croaker continue to come from the James and York Rivers on squid and crab with decent hardheads in the 17-inch range filling coolers from near the Coleman Bridge, York River State Park and the oyster beds near the James River Bridge.

Although most anglers are more interested in inshore species, the deep dropping scene will attract more attention when sea bass become legal again on the 19th this month. As the dog fish begin to move out, more boats will target tilefish, black bellied rosefish and grouper along the Canyon edges once they can get out.

Offshore fishing will begin to improve this month as the action off Carolina moves northward. The fleets out of Oregon Inlet are finding yellowfin tuna, wahoo and dolphin along with a few billfish in the mix.

Striped bass harvest prohibited on DE spawning grounds through May 31st

The Delaware Division of Fish and Wildlife reminds anglers that during striped bass spawning season, which continues through midnight on May 31, it is unlawful for any person to take and retain any striped bass from the Nanticoke River, the C&D Canal and the Delaware River north of and including the south jetty at the mouth of the C&D Canal, or any tributaries of these waterways. Under Delaware state regulations, anglers are required to release any striped bass caught in these spawning areas during the spawning season, with no harvest of striped bass allowed.

In addition, regulations require anglers fishing during spawning season on any striped bass spawning ground with natural bait to use a non-offset circle hook, also known as an "in-line" circle hook.

With two exceptions, striped bass season is open all year, with a size limit of 28 inches and a possession limit of two fish per day. As noted above, striped bass season is open for catch and release only on spawning grounds from April 1 through May 31. In addition, a slot season is in effect from July 1 through Aug. 31 in Delaware waters of the Delaware River, the Delaware Bay and their tributaries. During the slot season, anglers may only keep striped bass from 20 to 26 inches and harvest is limited to two fish per angler. The spawning season closure and slot limits do not apply to Delaware's coastal waters, Indian River Inlet or the Inland Bays where the minimum size limit remains 28 inches year-round, with a two-fish possession limit.

For complete information on fishing in Delaware, pick up a copy of the 2012 Delaware Fishing Guide at your local tackle shop or license dealer, or check it out online. For more information, call the Fisheries section at 302-739-9914.

F.I.N. numbers available with Delaware recreational fishing license purchase

Since 2009, recreational anglers fishing Delaware waters have been required to obtain a Delaware Fisherman Information Network (F.I.N.) number. Since last year, the required F.I.N. number is generated automatically on all individual fishing licenses sold through Delaware's electronic licensing systems.

License buyers will be asked to provide basic information and complete a five-question survey to receive their F.I.N. number as part of their fishing license. The F.I.N. number appears on individual recreational fishing licenses next to the signature of the license holder, and must be in the angler's possession while actively fishing.

Some anglers must still visit www.delaware-fin.com or call 800-432-9228 toll-free to obtain a free F.I.N. number: license-exempt anglers, including Delaware residents 65 and older; non-resident boat fishing license holders who do not have an individual license; and individuals fishing on licensed boats who do not have an individual license.

Generally, a fishing license is required for anglers age 16 and older, and must be in the possession of anglers who are fishing, crabbing or clamming in all Delaware waters, including both tidal and non-tidal areas. A resident fishing license costs \$8.50 and a non-resident license costs \$20 per year.

Delaware's F.I.N. registry was established so that the state could provide required information to the National Marine Fisheries Service for its federal registry. Anglers who join the Delaware registry are added to the federal registry without paying any fees.

Delaware anglers who fish on the NJ side of the Delaware Bay and River or in NJ coastal waters are required to register with New Jersey's Saltwater Recreational Registry Program. Participation is free of charge.





Tackle Shop

You know the old saying, "Be careful for what you wish for because it might come true." Well, in this case it did!



A couple of years ago, Joe Morris at Lewes Harbour Marina showed me the "hot lure" for striper fishing in the Delaware Bay. It was a Stretch 25 in the Cabo Sunset design. I used the lure that fall and caught a load of striped bass.

Last year, Lanny Deal, a representative for the Mann Bait Company, manufacturer of the popular Stretch artificial lures, stopped by my office. I expressed to Lanny how much I love their 10-inch Stretch

Imitator lures and how they are striper catching machines. However, I would love them more if they came in the Cabo Sunset style. Well, don't you know that based on our suggestion, Mann now offers such a lure. I was fortunate enough to get a prototype this past fall and it worked great. I caught many stripers on it and it is now my "go to" Stretch lure for striped bass.

Some local tackle shops are already carrying it, but if they don't have it in stock, just ask them to order it for you. You won't be sorry.

Here's another case of a company responding to the desires of local fishermen.

Binnacle Lures, run by local anglers Rick and Teresa Grapes, has been producing

top quality lures and dredges for several years and have been featured in Marlin Magazine.

Over the winter, some captains put in a request for a heavier mojo lure than you can typically find for striper fishing. Most tackle shops only carry mojos up to 32 oz. Some captains were looking for ones as heavy as 50 oz. that they can run right off their transom.



In response, Binnacle Tackle is producing two new bullethead lures marketed under their Chesapeake Lures line. They weigh 35 and 50 oz., have 3D eyes, replaceable skirts and hooks attached to heavy duty swivels.

The products are brand new and should be available in

local tackle shops in the coming months. For more information log on to BinnacleTackle.com.

Berkley has come out with a new product designed to help fisherman carry their fishing rods along with a 5-gallon bucket.



The Berkley Bucket Rod Holder features steel rod construction, an electrostatic finish and mounts in either an upright or angled position on a standard, 5-gallon bucket.

Unless your bucket weighs a ton, I don't see using the rod holder while you are fishing, since the bucket would definitely tip over when a fish takes your bait, but it would make carrying your equipment a little easier. The Rod Holder has an MSRP of \$2.99.



Species Management Updates

Tautog

Effective May 16th, Maryland regulations for tautog allow for two fish per person per day, with a minimum size of 16 inches. The 2 fish creel limit will remain in effect through October 31st.

Black Sea Bass

The 2012 season for black sea bass will officially open in the state waters of Maryland at 12:01 AM on May 19th. The minimum size will be 12.5-inches, and the daily creel limit will be 25 fish per person per day. Maryland state waters include the coastal bays, inlet, surf and offshore waters out three nautical miles

and the Chesapeake Bay. For the black sea bass fishery in Federal waters from 3 to 200 miles offshore, NOAA is working to open Federal waters as early as May 19th, however NOAA is cautioning that if the final rule is not published in time, the offshore fishery in Federal waters will open on May 22nd, the same date as last year. Please check the Maryland DNR or Coastal Fisherman websites for confirmation at: <http://dnr.maryland.gov/fisheries> and www.coastalfisherman.net.

Black sea bass are highly sought by both commercial and recreational fishermen throughout the Mid-Atlantic. The species is jointly managed by the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission

(ASMFC) and the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council (MAFMC).

The most recent assessment in 2010 indicated that the current population size is above the fisheries management biomass goal, and that overfishing is not occurring.

Black sea bass are managed by dividing a total annual quota between the recreational fishery (51%) and the commercial fishery (49%). Recreational fishery management measures include the same combination of minimum size limits, bag limits and fishing seasons set for the entire coast. The commercial quota is divided into state-by-state quotas annually. Specific management measures for the commercial fishery are set by each state, including minimum size limits, minimum mesh requirements for trawls, a moratorium on entry into the fishery and closed seasons

Black sea bass inhabit Atlantic coastal waters from the Gulf of Maine to the Florida Keys, concentrating in areas from Cape Cod, Massachusetts to Cape Canaveral, Florida. Two distinct stocks of black sea bass exist along the Atlantic coast with overlapping ranges. The northern stock, which migrates seasonally and spawns off of New England in the late summer, is managed by the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission and the Mid-Atlantic Fisheries Management Council. The southern stock, which spawns off of the Chesapeake Bay in the early summer, is managed by the South Atlantic Fishery Management Council.

Black sea bass are a

temperate reef fish, inhabiting rocky bottoms near pilings, wrecks, and jetties. Black sea bass are protogynous hermaphrodites, which mean they start life as a female and when they reach 9 to 13-inches in length they change sex to become males, initiated by visual cues.

Proposed Free Fishing Area Regulations

With the expansion of the Chesapeake Bay Sportfish license (now known as the Chesapeake and Coastal Sportfishing license) to include Maryland's coastal waters, requests for Free Fishing Areas locations on Maryland's coast have been brought to the Maryland Department of Natural Resources. To explore requests from the Town of Ocean City and the DNR's Coastal Fisheries Advisory Committee, DNR Fisheries staff visited three recommended areas (Northside Park at 125th street, the bulkhead behind the Ocean City Convention Center at 42nd street and the Chicago Avenue bulkhead between 2nd and 4th streets). These three areas have been formally requested by the Town of Ocean City and the MD DNR's Coastal Fisheries Advisory Committee. MD DNR Fisheries Service staff met with representatives of local bait & tackle stores, fishing clubs and town officials to obtain feedback on support for the three proposed areas. After review, the Department has proposed creating sites at Northside Park and Chicago Avenue. The proposal will be printed in the Maryland Register in mid-June. A 30-day public comment period would then take place. If there is no substantive opposition, the regulation to create the two free fishing areas could be enacted in August.




